

Export Regulations

The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) is responsible for implementing and enforcing the Export Administration Regulations (EAR), which regulate the export of most commercial items. All MCLI products are subject to export control under the United States Bureau of Industry and Security ([BIS](http://www.bis.doc.gov)) (www.bis.doc.gov). The following information is for customers and partners who need to understand the specific shipping documentation, record keeping, and post-shipment reporting required for export of MCLI products.

MCLI components have been determined EAR99, no license required, by the Bureau of Industry and Security, but the “end use” and “end user” of our goods ultimately determines if the export will require licensing. This rule applies to both governments and non-government end-users, but varies by country the export is being received in. Please refer to BIS for a current listing of approved countries.

We can ship without a license to any end-user (not on the denied entity list in Supplement 4 to Part 744 of the EAR) in any country as long as they are not on the embargoed country list.

Under no circumstance can MCLI products be exported to an embargoed country or to any party/affiliate listed on the entity, Treasury Department designated nationals, unverified, or denied persons lists. For links to each of these lists, please go to www.bis.doc.gov/licensing/exportingbasics.htm.

MCLI randomly audits export documents to ensure the stated end-use of our goods was indeed received by the end-user information supplied. If any information has deviated from the documents submitted to MCLI, it will then be reported to The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS).

Because regulations are subject to change, we recommend that you obtain your own legal advice when attempting to export. The imports of products and goods are restricted in some countries. If you have any questions, we recommend that you consult legal counsel in the appropriate country or the applicable governmental agencies in the particular country.
